## SPECIAL EDUCATION: Certification Information/ Licensing

The following information (updated 8/19) is based on current guidelines issued by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE).

## Certification: "Highly Qualified" in Special Education (K-12)

SPED teachers that are in a "self-contained" classroom, provide direct instruction, and assess core subject area grades, must be highly qualified (HQ). In order to be highly qualified, SPED teachers must have the HQ endorsement on their teaching license.

You may take the (1) PLT (see above) and (2) Special Education Praxis tests and add a content-specific endorsement through 21 hours of coursework with a grade of "C" or higher <u>OR</u> by taking and passing a specialty area Praxis test (any content area). \*Please note: If you choose this option, you would be highly qualified in this specialty area ONLY in teaching either special education or regular education students.
