FAQ

What grades will I teach?

Our program prepares teachers for grades 7-12.

Are some teaching subjects more competitive?

Yes. Due to the high number of applications in English and social studies, these teaching positions are more competitive.

Do I need to take the GRE?

No. Acceptance is based on experience, GPA and rigor of undergraduate work. Once accepted, all recruits must pass the Praxis exam for state licensure.

Can I choose which graduate degree I earn?
