The Garbage Problem – Improper garbage <u>disposal</u> can cause <u>contamination</u> of <u>subterranean</u> water sources. <u>Relocating</u> garbage dumps doesn't <u>necessarily</u> solve this <u>incredibly unhealthful</u> problem. Laws <u>preceding</u> the <u>discovery</u> of this problem were <u>predictably relaxed</u> in terms of garbage <u>disposal</u>. Since the <u>discovery</u>, authorities have <u>proceeded</u> to <u>toughen</u> these laws and have <u>injected</u> funds into <u>reevaluating ongoing</u> practices. <u>Interjection</u> of <u>environmental organizations</u> has helped to <u>convince</u> an <u>incredulous</u> public of the depth of the problem and the need to <u>recycle</u>. Some garbage dumps have <u>receded</u> in size, but most have <u>increased</u> as the <u>unbelievable</u> amount of garbage <u>produced</u> continues to multiply <u>unnecessarily</u>.
